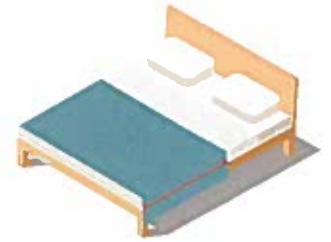


Hepatitis A Disease

Hepatitis A Symptoms:



YELLOWING OF
SKIN AND EYES
(JAUNDICE)



FEVER



NAUSEA, VOMITING,
DIARRHEA

Symptoms may also include: dark pee, pale poop, diarrhea, stomach pain, tiredness, lack of appetite. If you have Hepatitis A, you can infect others before you begin experiencing symptoms.

Prevent the Spread of Hepatitis A:



Wash your hands with soap and water after using the bathroom, after sexual activity, and before eating and preparing food.



Get vaccinated if you are at high risk for getting Hepatitis A!

WHO IS AT HIGH RISK?

- Street/recreational drug users.
- Anyone having oral or anal sex with infected persons, including men who have sex with men.
- Homeless or persons in transient living.
- Incarcerated people.
- People with chronic liver disease or immunocompromised.
- International travelers.
