    - It is really important to get clients to pre-register because legal help takes the longest time at PHC.
    - Also judges have to pull files so it is really important to pre-register in order to serve clients efficiently.
    - Volunteer Lawyers strongly suggest you encourage your clients to come to the monthly legal clinics.
    - Also going to the monthly clinics help the courts dockets, we want to make sure we are taking care of the resources available.
    - Pre-trail services are about to start at the jail to so they are going to secure resources before inmates are released.
    - Municipalities that have been confirmed to participate in PHC-Hoover, Irondale, Fultondale, Tarrant, Vestavia.
    - Volunteer Lawyers are working on obtaining more criminal attorneys for this year PHC.

- Please remember legal services and all the services at PHC have to be for people experiencing homeless. A One Roof team will be there to verify status be available especially for legal services and ids.
- Golden Ticket process will be changing. In the past, there have been golden tickets administered and no clients show up. Those changes will be emailed to agencies and included in the newsletter.
- Your agencies must have your pre-register papers in order to get a booth for PHC.
- Doors will open at 8:00 a.m. and close at 12:00 p.m. Michelle strongly suggests your clients show up early.
- Jefferson County department of health are there to do testing and flu shots.
- We are trying to work on getting the Crisis Center there to work with any clients who have crisis arise during PHC.
- Pastoral care will be there as always. Faith Chapel will supply some pastors. Any other clergy for the faith community are welcome to sign up.
- We will have youth services available at PHC.
- Lawson Cosmetology will be there for haircuts.
- UAB and St. Vincent's will be there for podiatry and wound care.
- Each person is paired with a smiling face. They are trained by Hands On or Faith Chapel. The volunteer stays with the client the entire time.
- Michelle would like to see city council members there to volunteer.
- Courtney stated if you are medical group you will have to eat on stage. Clients will be served first
  and then volunteers and agencies will be served. Please bring your own snacks if you are a
  provider.
- Lisa will search for medical alert bracelets for PHC for clients.
- Michelle wants to remind we are not advertising agencies at PHC.
- Emily Cook (United Way)- will be handling media for PHC. (business card insert)
- Michelle wants to remind we need to be careful how we advertise for PHC. We want to make sure we are advertising to people who are experiencing homelessness.
- Dental services will be provided. Because it costs so much to extract teeth onsite, the Jefferson
  County Department of Health give out vouchers for free dental care for a year. This is for clients
  who are transitioning.
- The UAB School of Dentistry will be there administrating exams.
- We will have free cell phone services this year.
- DHR will be there for snap but will not be there for jobs program.
- PHC can be advertise during the PIC count.

- PHC is heavily advertise with Church of the Reconciler and our street outreach team will also get the word out.
- Wristbands will be color coded as usual.
